





I hope everyone had a good week. The kingdoms were able to visit the woods this week and carried out some lovely tasks and even have their lunch there. As the keyworker bubble went over 15 on Monday, we have a new mini bubble- 'Kingdom' set up in the breakfast club room (renamed permanently as 'The Meadow'). They have worked really well to adapt into this new room and have also shared what they have been up to this week. Their new kingdom name is called the 'Majestic Meadow'

The Dfe yesterday produced guidance on how to invite all the children into September. In the last month alone there has been at least 63 covid-19 emails including 24 updates to existing guidance. I will be spending time looking carefully through this new document and draw up plans and risk assessments in consultation with staff and governors. The details will be communicated as soon I can but may be during the summer holidays. Staff met this week to discuss our plans for the change in curriculum for the next academic year, and what important knowledge and skills may need reinforcing from the previous year's curriculum. We will informally check in September and October through observations, quizzes and games to see where children might need extra support, while continuing to offer our balanced and broad curriculum. I have also made up a summer holiday pack with some optional activities for your children to complete if you would like before September.

I am now able to give details out about summer holiday club after receiving further guidance about after school clubs from the Dfe and talking to staff about volunteering to work over the summer, extra to their normal contracts. During the end of the summer break we will need to carry out another deep clean and staff will need to prepare for the full opening in September as it will be different to a normal start to the academic year. There is no requirement for schools to open during the holidays, but we would like to still run summer holiday club and we will be able offer it to parents from Monday 27th July until Friday 7th August. The same protective measures will be implemented as we did during the full lockdown and we are only able to take up to 15 children (who can be from any year group at school) over the whole week to keep a consistent bubble. It will be a first come first serve basis and to ensure we don't make a loss on this service we will only be able to book for the whole day which is 9am-4pm. If we are unable to get enough interest in this, then we may need to cancel this provision. Please let us know by Friday 10th July by replying to a separate email being sent today if you are interested and then we will send out further details.

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Key Reminders- What happens if there is a confirmed case of coronavirus (COVID-19) in a setting?

When a child, young person or staff member develops symptoms compatible with coronavirus (COVID-19), they should be sent home and advised to self-isolate for 7 days and arrange to have a test to see if they have COVID-19. They can do this by visiting NHS.UK to arrange or contact NHS 119 via telephone if they do not have internet access.

Their fellow household members should self-isolate for 14 days. All staff and students who are attending an education or childcare setting will have access to a test if they display symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19), and are encouraged to get tested in this scenario.

Where the child, young person or staff member tests negative, they can return to their setting and the fellow household members can end their self-isolation.

Where the child, young person or staff member tests positive, the rest of their class or group within their childcare or education setting should be sent home and advised to self-isolate for 14 days. The other household members of that wider class or group do not need to self-isolate unless the child, young person or staff member they live with in that group subsequently develops symptoms.

As part of the national test and trace programme, if other cases are detected within the cohort or in the wider setting, Public Health England's local health protection teams will conduct a rapid investigation and will advise schools and other settings on the most appropriate action to take.

What has been going on in the 'Five Kingdoms of School' this week?



This week we have been doing some independent writing using exciting pictures as our inspiration. The children have ALL done amazingly at this and are really showing how ready they are for Year 1. For the first time EVER we've also had some birds visiting our window bird feeder so the children have also been excited to see which different birds visit our window.



This week in Birchleyville, we have begun to complete some transition work linked to our very exciting journeys into secondary school! We looked at the school websites and created logos for our secondary schools based on their ethos and values. We also reflected on some of our favourite memories at N&C and wrote letters to the new reception children telling them all about our wonderful primary school. As well as all of this, we have created film clips for virtual sports day, continued rehearsing our play as well as practising songs for our leavers' assembly – phew! Busy but fun!

We created some brilliant pastel pictures of the Endurance. We also had a great morning at the woods on Wednesday and created some fantastic artwork.



This week we have been to the woods, where we created some woodland collages and made magic wands. We have worked on fractions in maths and have been designing our own labyrinths full of twists and twists.


